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

Back at the resort, relax and get pampered at the terrific spa offering soothing treatments either in a treatment room or by the private outdoor cascade pool for a blissful hour of relaxation. Afterwards, head for a sumptuous fine-dining experience at Harbour Village's exquisite La Balandra Restaurant and Bar which was uniquely designed after an antique Spanish ship that extends over the water and serves up fresh creative dishes excellently prepared.
