## Transforming Lanai

After eight months and multimillions spent, the Four Seasons Resort Lanai reopened Feb. 1. It, like most of the island a few miles west of Maui, was purchased in 2012 by Oracle founder

Larry Ellison, who set about retooling the 217-room beach resort. The new iteration features an



11-treatment-room spa, two pools, including an adults-only option with waterfalls and lava rock grottos, the stylish Japanese restaurant Nobu, steakhouse One Forty and several lounges.
