RIGHT NOW IS THE BEST TIME TO BE A HOTEL LOVER

FOR THIS 20TH EDITION OF THE HOT LIST—

our picks of the year's top hotel openings-editors and reporters crisscrossed 6 continents and 36 countries to review hundreds of new properties firsthand. We came back with 60 outstanding winners that represent not just the vanguard of the hotel world but where travelers are headed next-and why. It was, all told, a damn good year for hotels and travelers alike. A year when that hackneyed term design hotel came to mean something again, and when eco-friendly stopped conjuring weak showers and hospital lighting but something truly inspired. It was a year that saw hotel developers putting beds where travelers actually want to go-be it neighborhoods like London's Notting Hill and Rome's Monti or emerging destinations such as Lecce and Chengdu. A year when smaller U.S. cities caught our attention (go, Pittsburgh and Baltimore!). When hotel kitchens stepped up to compete with the restaurants down the block (and sometimes poached their chefs). ¶ It was a year that saw major brands acting like indies, while smaller brands like Faena and Soho House copped big-chain swagger. And it was the year France and Italy thoroughly smoked the competition, fielding 6 winners each. Other destinations came out swinging: England with 5; Australia with 3; and Germany, Turkey, Portugal, Mexico, the D.R., and the great nation of Texas, each with 2. ¶ Of course the real winners here were ... well, us. Travelers in 2016 have all the more reason to get out there and spend the night in style-60 great reasons, to start with, from Alsace to Zanzibar. Here's where to point your arrow next.

A new wave is breaking in this endless-summer surf idyll, with **Halcyon House** (left), north of Byron Bay, riding in on that easy-breezy sophistication Aussies are known for.

LECCE, ITALY

Why isn't everyone going to Puglia? La Fiermontina brings chic, up-to-date minimalism to baroque Lecce, the so-called Florence of the South.

PORTLAND, MAINE

New England's coolest, foodiest small city (or is that largest village?) gets a long-overdue lodgings boost with The Press Hotel (repurposed from an old newspaper HQ), where the restaurant and bar draw locals and guests alike.

SHELTER ISLAND, NEW YORK

Once your only nofail option was a rental, but **The Chequit** has changed all that and has us falling for Long Island's quiet frontier all over again.

SOMETIMES TOO MUCH IS EXACTLY ENOUGH

Two big-city hotels made unapologetically big statements this year, with flamboyant design that bordered on kooky—yet somehow actually worked. If the Faena Hotel Miami Beach (below) comes off like a Baz Luhrmann-directed fever dream, that's because it kind of is one: The filmmaker collaborated on its zany interiors. Halfway

around the globe, <u>The Reverie Saigon</u> does absolutely nothing halfway, from the emerald-green Bechstein grand piano to the 16-foot lobby sofa clad in purple ostrich leather. Is maximalism the new minimalism? Discuss amongst yourselves—we'll be at the Faena's gloriously OTT bar, watched over by a giant stuffed white peacock.

DESIGN HOTEL IS A LEGIT TERM AGAIN

In an age when any half-wit pretender can slap an Eames chair in the lobby and call itself a design hotel, five challengers are reclaiming the name. We'd check into each just to check out these inspired details.

Casa Fayette, Guadalajara,

Mexico (bottom left) The pink-marble lobby bar, Deco-themed stainedglass walls, and gold-leaf ceiling panels.

Elma Arts Complex Luxury Hotel, Zikhron Ya'akov, Israel

The mesmerizing Brutalist architecture (by Yaakov Rechter) and soaring 450seat concert hall.

Les Bains, Paris (top left) The bloodred-lacquer walls, and the tiled dance floor-a

holdover from its incarnation as a notorious nightclub.

Yndo Hotel, Bordeaux (top right) The bold pop palette and provocative art in the public rooms—in a town where old-school refinement typically rules.

The Zetter Townhouse Marylebone, London

The fearless approach to color and texture—and maximum display of curiosfrom designer Russell Sage.

THESE NEIGHBORHOOD HOTELS HAVE CRACKED THE ZIP CODE

Seriously, why are so many otherwise-great city hotels stuck in meh neighborhoods? (We're talking to you, "Central Business District.") Thankfully, some of our favorite new stays are putting us up in the very parts of town we came to explore. In Paris, the $\underline{H\^{o}tel}$ Providence (right) not only nails the details (House of Hackney wallpaper; in-room cocktail carts), it has the address we've been pining for-on a quiet square in the 10th, a quick stroll from the Canal St-Martin. In the shadow of the Colosseum, Rome's eminently hip Monti district at last has a hotel that fits the hood: The town house-style Fifteen Keys Hotel sits on the Via Urbana, steps from our favorite aperitivi spot, Ai Tre Scalini. And when we're in London, you'll find us ensconced at the handsome 51-room <u>Laslett</u> in Notting Hill, pretending like we live there.

RECAUSE...

SOMETHING IS SERIOUSLY UP IN RICHMOND

(YEAH: RICHMOND!)

It's the urban trend of the moment: so-called second-tier U.S. cities stealing cachet (and young creative talent) from the bigger guns. Now they're getting lodgings to match. Take Virginia's capital, where the J.B. Mosby & Co. department store—a relic from 1916—has been ingeniously transformed into the art-themed Quirk

Hotel (below). Cloying name aside, it's become the destination in a revitalized downtown, and an emblem of Richmond's Arts & Cultural District. A roof-top terrace offers skyline views, while the Maple & Pine restaurant—a reference to the Quirk's lustrous century-old wood floors—has a zingy fresh tomatoverbena consommé and a buttermilk fried chicken we'd drive across Virginia to eat.

...AND PITTSBURGH

If Pittsburgh isn't a contender for the coolest city in America right now, someone's got "cool" all wrong. Cool means a fanatical sports town that's also defined by high culture (museums, universities, its own Carnegie Hall), where Roberto Clemente and Andy Warhol are held in equal esteem. Cool means a food scene that's both current and cozily retro, globally informed yet grounded in place. Where thirty- and seventysomethings drink at the same perfectly aged bars. And cool now means having an Ace Hotel, which took over a 1909 YMCA building in the percolating East Liberty district, then staffed it with

proud Pittsburghers excited to share their town. How cool is that.

...AND BALTIMORE

The only hitch at The Ivy Hotel is the temptation to hole up there all day long. Sure, you could step right out and explore vibrant Mount Vernon, or have a hotel car drop you anywhere in town, 24/7—and there's a hell of a lot to do, see, and eat in Baltimore these days. But with those deep sunken tubs, soft cashmere throws on canopied beds, and extras like free movies and free minibar booze, can we blame you for never wanting to leave?



BECAUSE... VENICE DOESN'T HAVE TO BE A ONE-NIGHT STAND

You know the drill here: Hit Rialto and Dorsoduro, down an ombretta, leave before the crowds make you crazy. Which is why Italy's first JW Marriott (below)set on a resortlike private island

just minutes from San Marcois such a revelation. With its olive groves, lush gardens, and knockout pools, you (and the kids!) will be happy to stay Venice-bound for days.

ONE CARIBBEAN BEACH SOMEHOW LANDED TWO OUTSTANDING RESORTS

The Dominican Republic wants you back. And this time it's ready to earn your love-with two equally stylish (yet totally distinct) retreats sharing a mile-long crescent of sand on the island's north shore. At one end you'll find the ninebungalow Playa Grande Beach Club (above), with its laid-back communal vibe and bright, playful design by Celerie Kemble. At the other is Amanera (left), the second Aman outpost in the Caribbean and the brand's first golf resort. Expect the group's customary polished minimalism and obsessive attention to detail, plus panoramic beach views from the cliffside pool and bungalows. Suddenly, the D.R. feels very much like the place to be.




